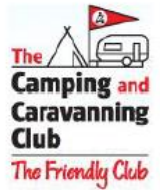

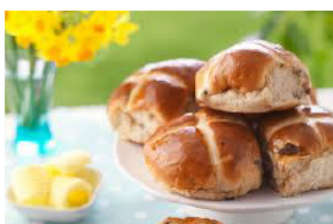
EASTER FUNDRAISING MEET BALLARD SCHOOL, NEW MILTON
